

As a representative of your community, you will find the role enjoyable, challenging and stimulating with involvement in matters as diverse as recreation, libraries, the environment, land use planning, health, roads and many more. Meeting fees and some expenses are paid. Training is provided prior to nomination and further if successfully elected to equip you to undertake this important role for your community.

Vacancies

One (1)

The term for the vacancy is until the October 2025 elections

Who can nominate?

Any person who is an Australian Citizen over the age of 18 years who is an elector of the district and is not disqualified under the *Local Government Act 1995* may nominate for election to council.

When to nominate

Nominations open on **Thursday 19 September 2024** and close at 4.00pm sharp on **Thursday 26 September 2024**.

Where to nominate

At the Shire Administration Centre, 58 Johnston Street, Dalwallinu.

Nominations must be on a prescribed form that is available from the council office. A \$100 nomination deposit is required as well as a profile of the candidate consisting of no more than 1,000 characters (including spaces). You can include a recent passport sized photo of the candidate's head or head and shoulders if you wish. If unable to personally attend to nominate, an authorised agent can do this on a candidate's behalf.

If you wish (but is not compulsory) you can also provide additional supplementary candidate information in text form of up to but no more than 2,000 characters (including spaces). This supplementary candidate information will be displayed alongside your candidate profile on the local government's website and/or council office noticeboard but will not be included in the election package that is posted to electors with the ballot paper(s).

The rain has filled the rock pools and the entire location is green and gold. There isn't too many orchid sightings as we move into the later time in the season but there is still the full carpets of everlastings outlining the edge of the rock formations.



When exploring this area, we strongly advise you to watch your step near the wet rocks as they can be slippery.





Dalwallinu Shire September 2024 Wildflower Report



Wubin Rocks — There is small patches of the everlasting carpets scattered through out this area. The wattle trees are full of colour which only adds to the scenery at Wubin Rocks. Located only 27kms north-east of Dalwallinu, this spot is also a free self-sufficient camp.

In the Wubin town, there is the **Wubin Museum**. The Volunteers and community that have put this together have done an amazing job preserving and displaying the shires history.



The Old Well - Located here in the town of Dalwallinu, the Old Well is good little historical sight with a handful of little tracks going throughout some bushland that is home to bee orchids, donkey orchids, waitzia, wattle and everlastings which are all in bloom.

Shire maps are free and available to help guide you through. These can be collected from the Discovery Centre.



Buntine Rocks – Another location that is good for a overnight stay, picnic or scenic walk. The road to Buntine is good for any vehicle. There is a sign that indicates "no caravans past this point" and from then onwards it is advised that AWD or 4WD are the only vehicles to go on.

Mia Moon - This location is home to bee orchids, donkey orchids, sun orchids, sundews or rainbows, narrow leaf squill, wattle and carpets of everlastings.

Mia Moon can either be a self-guided drive or walk through on tracks there. The land there is covered in colour. This is also a self sufficient camp site. Please ensure that you take your rubbish away with you. The shire provides free biodegrabate bags that you can take with you and help Keep Australia Beautiful. These bags can be collected from the Dalwellinu Discovery Centre.

Wildlfowers at Mia Moon can be found on both sides of the road but the better bunch of orchids and flowers to see will be located on the left side of the road if you're travelling west on Nugadong West Road. Jibberding Reserve – Travelling north on the Great Northern Highway, located only 43kms out of town, Jibberding Reserve has an abundance of everlastings. As far as the eye can see, there is a rainbow of everlastings.

Jibberding Reserve can either be a self-guided drive or walk through on tracks there. The land there is covered in colour. This is also a self sufficient camp site.



Wasley Road – Home to our BLOOMING wreath flowers. There is currently 7+ wreath flowers located a couple kms up the road ready for you to take their picture.

Local Government Extraordinary Election - CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS

ROLL CLOSES: 5.00pm, Friday 20 September 2024

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the in-person Local Government Extraordinary Election on 9 November 2024, if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Dalwallinu.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5.00pm 25 August 2023. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll but meet the eligibility criteria for this roll, you can enrol online via the WA Electoral Commission website https://www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Dalwallinu and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to vote. If you are not on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Dalwallinu you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Dalwallinu prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact the Shire of Dalwallinu for details.

Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Dalwallinu to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three (3) months following the date of the application to enrol.

Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two (2) people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two (2) people who are on either the State of Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Enrolment Forms - Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5.00pm, Friday 20 September 2024. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Dalwallinu.

Congratulations to the Dalwallinu Hockey ladies on a great win in the Grand Final at Goomalling.


It is always good to bring home some more silverware.

Benefits of E-Rates

- Quicker way to receive your annual rates notices (final notices and instalments are not available via eRates)
- Ease while travelling for a long time, on holiday or living overseas.
- You still get your notice if you have moved and forgot to update your postal address.

Things to be aware of before applying:

- If you are not the Owner or Agent for the Property, you are not eligible to register.
- There can only be ONE email address for each notice.
- If there is more than one owner of the property and other owner/s apply to receive an electronic notice, the eRates system will by default send the notice to the last registered email address.
- Once the registration is processed by the rates officer, you will receive a confirmation email.

Are you eligible for a Rates Concession?

If you hold one of the following concession cards, own and occupy a rated property within the Shire you may be eligible for a concession on your annual rates. Not applicable to properties used for commercial purposes including rural properties.

- Pensioner Concession Card
- State Concession Card
- Commonwealth Seniors Health Card together with a WA Seniors Card or
- WA Seniors Card

To Apply

Registration is not done through the Shire of Dalwallinu but with the Water Corporation. To apply contact the Water Corporation on 1300 659 951 or complete the registration form available at

http://www.watercorporation.com.au/Bill-and-account/Apply-for-a-concession

The Water Corporation will notify the Shire of Dalwallinu. Rates must be paid in full prior to 30 June of the rating year to receive the concession. Unsure if you already claim the concession? If you are already claiming the concession it will show as "State Government Rebate Allowed" on your Annual Rates Notice.



Department of Transport - Licensing Hours Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 4.00pm



The Shire of Dalwallinu offer licensing facilities on behalf of the Department of Transport. The licensing hours are set by the Department of Transport.

Please ensure you attend the offices early and allow adequate time for processing of your paperwork as the Department of Transport Licensing computers close at 4pm.

Shire staff do not have access after that time to Licensing computers.

Are you a Responsible Pet Owner?

The Cat laws are about encouraging responsible pet ownership and reducing the number of unwanted cats in the community and the number that are euthanised each year. All cats that have reached six months of age are required by law to be:

- micro-chipped
- sterilised; and
- registered with the Shire

Under The Dog Act 1976 and regulations, any dog over the age of 3 months should be registered within the Shire. All dogs need to be micro-chipped. Proof of micro-chipping is required at time of registration.

Please be a responsible owner and secure your animals by registration. Legislation applies to Cats after six months of age and Dogs after 3 months. Registrations are due on 31 October each year.

Please don't risk losing your precious pets by not having them registered. Call into the Shire and make sure your animals are safe.

LIBRARY ON WHEELS




DALWALLINU LIBRARY

Sheep and goat electronic identification (eID)



Consultation on regulatory amendments to enable the transition to mandatory sheep and goat eID in Western Australia

In 2022, all Australian Agriculture Ministers agreed to support a national transition from visual tagging to electronic identification (eID) of sheep and goats to improve traceability.

The National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) visual tagging system for sheep and goats will be phased out from 1 January 2025 in Western Australia, with full adoption of mandatory eID to be achieved by 1 July 2026.

In order to implement eID in WA, the current <u>Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Identification and Movement of Stock And Apiaries) Regulations 2013</u> (the Regulations) must be amended.

- The background and amendments are summarised in the **consultation paper**.
- You can read the full version of the draft Regulations in the consultation draft.

Have your say

We are now seeking your feedback on the amended Regulations.

Noting that sheep and goat eID is a nationally agreed objective, this consultation will only consider feedback relevant to the proposed amendments. It is strongly recommended to read the <u>consultation</u> <u>paper</u> and the consultation frequently asked questions (FAQs) so it is clear what is in scope.

Method


- 1. Preheat oven to 180° celsius


